

- 63. & 65 Across & 66 Across: a **LOGICAL FALLACY** in which the premises include the conclusion or assume that the conclusion is true; also called a Circular Argument. Example: *I know that God exists because the Bible tells me so* (Three Words, [7], [3], [8])

- 68. & 65 Across & 66 Across: a **LOGICAL FALLACY** in which one of the protagonists unilaterally attempts to alter the premises with which the debate commenced, in such a way as to make it increasingly difficult to comply; Example: A Creationist demands evidence for a transitional species to fill a gap in the fossil record. When such evidence is discovered, it merely gives rise to demands for evidence to fill two new perceived gaps. (Three Words, [6], [3], [9])

"STRAIGHT" CLUES: down

1. & 38 Down & 47 Down: A mode of argument with valid uses but often applied as a **LOGICAL FALLACY** attempting to push an argument's conclusions to illogical limits. Example:

Father: Why did you start smoking? Daughter: All my friends smoke.

Father: If all your friends jumped off a cliff, would you do that too?

(Three Words, [8], [2], [8])

- 2. Metric unit of measure, equal to 100 square meters [3]
- 3. Recompense [3]
- 4. & 36 Down: a **LOGICAL FALLACY** which argues that a case is an exception to a rule based upon an irrelevant characteristic. Example: *Tobacco has many health risks but it should not be treated like other drugs because it has a long social history and taxing tobacco provides much revenue.* (Two words, [7], [8])
 - 5. Japanese poem of seventeen syllables, in three lines of five, seven, and five [5]
 - 6. Carpenter's corner joint [5]
- 7. & 31 Down: a **LOGICAL FALLACY** used in an argument to force one's opponent into an extreme position by making the assumption that there are only two alternative choices. Example: "*If you're not with us, you're against us.*" Being neutral is not offered as a valid third option. (Two words, [5], [9])

- 18. & 46 Down: a **LOGICAL FALLACY** in which a course of action is objected to on the grounds that once taken it will inevitably result in a sequence of further actions leading to undesirable consequence results; Example: *You can't tax food; next thing you know, they'll be taxing air.* (Two words, [8], [5])
- 21. & 32 Down: a **LOGICAL FALLACY** in which the opponent is personally attacked rather than his or her argument; Example: *He knows nothing about the economy he doesn't even have a job* (Two words, [2], [7])
- 23. & 35 Down: a **LOGICAL FALLACY** in which the conclusion does not follow from the premises; Example: *Homeopathic medicines have no side effects therefore they are better than prescription drugs* (Two words, [3], [8])
- 25. & 41 Down: a **LOGICAL FALLACY** based on misrepresentation of an opponent's position; Example: Person A admits to disliking rap music. Person B accuses person A of being racist. (Two words, [5], [3])
- 27. & 37 Down: a **LOGICAL FALLACY** in which a person turns a charge back on his or her accuser: also Known as: "You Too Fallacy" or "the pot calling the kettle black"; Example: A person on trial for war crimes tries to justify himself by claiming that the opposing side committed such crimes. (Two words, [2], [6])
- 30. & 43 Down: a **LOGICAL FALLACY** comes to a conclusion based solely on the order of events, rather than taking into account other factors that might apply; Example: We never had this problem before those people moved into the neighbourhood (Two words, [4], [3])
